In 2019, cinemas in Malta and Gozo projected 409 different film titles and registered a total of 748,568 admissions.

Cinema Statistics: 2019

In 2019, there were six cinema establishments operating in Malta and Gozo, with a total of 28 screens and a seating capacity of 5,762 (Tables 1 and 2). Of these six cinemas, two were situated in Gozo.

In total, 409 film titles were exhibited in 2019, while the total screenings amounted to 29,184, with an average of 71 screenings per film. Last year, cinemas registered a total of 748,568 admissions. Maltese productions had 13,942 admissions with a total gross box office of €99,000 in 650 screenings. On the other hand, foreign productions had 734,626 admissions with a total gross box office of €4.952 million in 28,534 screenings (Table 4). The majority of cinemagoers, 91.2 per cent, have watched films originating from the United States. On their part, Maltese productions attracted 1.9 per cent of the total number of admissions (Table 5).

Admissions to 3D movies accounted for 18 per cent of the total, while 81 per cent of admissions were for digital non-3D films (Chart 1). A total of 705 film shows were projected in 2019, of which 82.7 per cent or 583 film shows were first-time releases (Table 6). Last year, 238 fiction films were screened in cinemas across Malta and Gozo. Films falling under this category attracted 72.0 per cent of total admissions. On their part, animation films amounted to 47 and attracted 26.4 per cent of total admissions (Table 7).

In 2019, the most popular movies were 'The Lion King', 'Aladdin' and 'Joker'. 'The Lion King' attracted 10.4 per cent of the total admissions, 'Aladdin' attracted 7.2 per cent of the total admissions and 'Joker' attracted 5.5 per cent of the total admissions (Table 8).

In terms of age classification, most films shown in Maltese cinemas were rated as '15' and '12A'. From all the films projected in 2019, 26.9 per cent were rated as '15', while 25.9 per cent were rated as '12A'. On the other hand, 3.4 per cent were rated as '18' (Table 9).

The running time of 60.9 per cent of the films projected in 2019 fell within the 76 to 120 minutes bracket. These were followed by screenings with a duration of 121 to 180 minutes, amounting to 26.9 per cent. As per type of screening, the 'Live/Encore' type of screenings, including operas, ballets, and theatre, had the longest running time with an average of 183 minutes. On the other hand, animation films were the shortest with an average running time of 87 minutes (Chart 6). With reference to the number of staff members, last year, cinemas were found to be employing an average of 134 persons, of which 77.6 per cent were engaged on a part-time basis (Table 11)

Chart 1. Percentage of admissions by film projection format: 2019



Chart 2: Average number of admissions per film by country of origin of film




Chart 3. Average number of screening days per film by country of origin of film






Chart 4: Average gross box office receipts per film by country of origin of film



Methodological Notes

- 1. A cinema establishment is defined as a fixed commercial business installation primarily engaged in the commercial projection of cinematographic audio-visual works (in 35mm and/or digital format using a minimum of 1.3K resolution), through a regular film programming schedule and ticketing system.
- 2. Information in this news release was obtained through a survey carried out among all active cinema establishments in Malta and Gozo during reference year 2019.
- 3. In this survey:
 - a film title refers to a single film that is screened across the various cinema establishments;
 - a film show, also includes feature films; short films; opera, ballet and theatre performances broadcasted from foreign theatres; music concerts broadcasted from abroad; and art exhibitions on screen etc.;
 - a screening refers to the number of times a film title is shown in the Maltese Islands irrespective of the cinema establishment which projects it.
- 4. Film details were verified with the Europa Cinemas and IMDB websites.
- 5. The survey is dependent on the information provided to the NSO by respondents. While every effort has been made to minimise the extent of under-reporting, the NSO is not responsible for inaccuracies that may emerge as a result of such under-reporting.
- 6. Totals may not add up due to rounding.
- 7. The data in this release should be considered as final, although minor revisions may be necessary subject to further provision of data.
