II. POPULATION

Explanatory Notes

The estimates of the Maltese population have been revised on the basis of the 1995 Census. Vital registration has been compulsory since the middle of the last century and there appears to be no under-registration of births and deaths.

Statistics on migration are provided only by the UK High Commission in Malta, whereas for returning migrants and others settling in Malta regular returns are received from the Customs. Information on citizenship is supplied by the Office of the Prime Minister. The Health Department provides the data on morbidity and causes of death. The crude birth rate is the number of births per thousand persons. Similarly, the crude death rate and crude marriage rate are ratios related to per thousand of population. Other rates are called 'specific' of the number of births to mothers aged 20-24 years per 1,000 women in that age-group in the population.

Other vital rates used in the text are: infant mortality rate - deaths of children aged under 1 year per 1,000 live births both events occurring in the same specific year; still-birth rate the number of children born dead in a specified year related to every 1,000 total births (live and still) in the same year.

III. JUSTICE AND CRIME

Explanatory Notes

This section presents data in respect of crime, court cases, juvenile delinquent, and convicts, compiled from statistics furnished by the Police Department, the Courts of Judicial Police and the Criminal Courts.

Court cases regarding criminal charges are subdivided into those dealt with summarily by the courts of Judicial Police (Criminal Branch) and those referred to the Criminal Courts as offences. All persons charged with an offence are brought in the first instance before a magistrate in the Court of Judicial Police by the Attorney General or his delegate either for summary judgement or sentence or for a preliminary examination of the circumstances surrounding the alleged offence. In the former case the magistrate can make a customary conviction. In the latter case, the evidence is submitted to the Attorney General who may either decline to prosecute, or proceed against the person in the Courts of Judicial Police for summary procedures or conviction, or otherwise treat the case as indictable and refer it to the Criminal Courts. In each case, the sentence inflicted is open to appeal in the respective Courts of Appeal.

Civil litigations are dealt with by different courts depending on the nature, extent or seriousness of the matter or dissent. These courts comprise a Civil branch of the Courts of Judicial Police and the First and Second Hall of the Civil Court, Commercial litigations are dealt with the Commercial Court. In all cases, awards by the respective Courts are appealable in the Courts of Appeal.

For the purpose of criminal statistics, 'juvenile' comprises the category of persons aged 16 years and under.

V. ELECTIONS AND REFERENDA

Explanatory Notes

The tables in this section have been compiled from reports and results of past elections which are published in the Government Gazette or else in booklet form available from the Department of Information, Malta.

The holding of general elections, registration of electors and the publication of a revised electoral register every six months are regulated by the General Elections Act (XXI) of 1991. Elections are conducted by a constituted body, namely the Electoral Commission under the chairmanship of the Chief Electoral Commissioner. The electoral system persisting since 1921 and sanctioned by various constitutions is that of proportional representation by means of the single transferable vote (STV). Another function of the Electoral Commission is to review electoral boundaries at intervals of not less than two and not more than five years.

In December 1970, the Electoral Commission reviewed and revised the Electoral Boundaries following Parliament's amendment to the Constitution which increased the number of seats from 50 to 55. It is to be noted that the only changes effected consisted of the assignment of split parishes to one division only; thus Fgura was placed in the Third Electoral Division whilst San Gwann and Ta' Xbiex were assigned to the Seventh Division.

As a result of an amendment to the electoral law whereby the number of electoral divisions was increased to thirteen, the Electoral Commission in February 1976 revised the electoral boundaries in the light of the provisions of Section 62 of the Constitution. In accordance with Section 61 of the Constitution, the Electoral Commission communicated to the Prime Minister and to the Leader of the Opposition, in May 1990, a revision of the Electoral Boundaries. The alterations were approved by a resolution in the House of Representatives and were subsequently published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd June, 1990.

In accordance with the Constitutional provisions (Section 61) and for the purposes of Section 15 of the General Elections Act, 1991, (Chap. 354), alterations of the boundaries of the Electoral Divisions were made by the Electoral Commission and published in Government Gazette No. 16,995 of the 29th September, 2000. A law providing for the setting up of Local Councils was passed through Parliament in 1993 (Act XV) establishing sixty-seven localities, 53 in Malta and 14 in Gozo. In December 1999 an amending Act added a new locality (68th) – Mtarfa. The first election for councillors of Mtarfa, was held in March 2000. This same amendment (Act XXI of 1999) also included an additional Schedule listing ten hamlets within established localities as follows: Fleur-de-Lys in Birkirkara, Santa Lucija in Kercem, Gwardamanga in Pieta', Paceville in San Giljan, Kappara in San Gwann, Ibraġ and Madliena in Swieqi, Marsalforn in Zebbug, Gozo, Bubaqra in Zurrieq and Xlendi in Munxar. The first Local Council elections based on the same principle used in national elections (proportional representation, each voter having a single transferable vote - STV) were held between November 1993 and May 1994. No elections were held in 1995. Subsequently, elections for 22 or 23 localities are being held every March in accordance with the relative Act such that every council is voted in for a period of three years. The number of councillors for each locality is determined according to the population in the locality where 5 is the minimum and 13 the maximum number of councillors.

The Local Councils Act provided (Sec. 6) for the annual publication of a local councils' electoral register, the first register being published in August 1993, correct as at 31st July, 1993. Subsequently the law was amended such that the electoral register would be issued in two formats every April and October. The first format is published by electoral divisions and the second format by locality showing, besides all Maltese electors, those British citizens satisfying electoral qualifications as per Section 6(b) of the Local Councils' Act and therefore entitled to vote for their respective local council.

Table A refers to the October 2000 Electoral Register of the second format, while Tables B1-B4 refer to the 23 Local Council Elections held on the 11th March 2000* which were based on the October 1999 Electoral Register.

Explanatory Notes

Labour Statistics: Data on manpower and registrations for employment are compiled and supplied by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC). Other data are compiled and supplied as indicated by way of footnote to the table concerned.

Index of Retail Prices: Data on prices are regularly collected by the Retail Price Index Unit at the National Statistics Office. The Index is compiled monthly and published on approval by the Retail Price Index Management Board.

The present index is based on a weighting structure derived from a Household Budgetary Survey taken in 1994. The present series of the index has a base 1995=100.

VII. FOREIGN TRADE

Explanatory Notes

The tables which follow are compiled from data supplied by the Customs Department. In 1993 Customs introduced ASYCUDA through which data are collected and received at NSO. Here the data are changed into a format suitable to be checked and verified.

Total imports include all merchandise and gold bullion imported into these islands whether intended for domestic consumption, for re-export or for warehousing in Government or private bonded stores, and exclude personal and household effects exempted from duty accompanying passengers, goods received by Diplomatic Missions, goods in transit and fresh fish caught in territorial seas.

Exports and re-exports include all merchandise shipped from wharves and approved Customs landing places. Goods exported in the condition in which they are imported are classified as re-exports.

The value of imports represents the price charged for the imported goods by the consigner as verified from the original invoice of goods, together with their cost of transport and insurance.

The value of exports and re-exports represents solely the price of the goods as shipped on board.

The country of origin of imports represents the place or country in which the goods were manufactured or processed. Goods re-exported to Malta after undergoing appreciable transformation in a particular country are shown as originating from the that country. Exports are classified as dispatched to the place or country of final destination.

IX. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

Explanatory Notes

'Tonnage' is the net registered tonnage unless otherwise stated. Vessels are classified 'with cargo' or 'in ballast' according to whether they transfer cargo at Malta or not.

Origin or destination do not necessarily refer to start or end of journey.

Data on shipping and air movements were extracted from documents filled with the Customs and Port Departments, and by captains of ships and aircraft.

Information on passengers and tourists was collected from documents made available by the Immigration Branch of the Police Department.

Data on vehicles and road accidents were supplied by the Licensing and Testing Department and Police Department accordingly.

Maltapost plc supplied information on postal and other services. Maltacom plc. furnished data on telegraph and telephone lines whilst TV licences data was supplied from P.B.S.

The Registry of Shipping and Seamen furnished data on registered vessels. Information on unitised cargo and number of units was supplied by the Cargo Handling Co. Ltd, the Port Work Scheme and Containers Storage Hal-Far.

X. INDUSTRY

Explanatory Notes

Data covers enterprises within most sections of NACE Rev.1 – the Statistical Classification of Economic Activities in the European Community. The NACE sections covered are the following; Mining and Quarrying, Manufacturing, Electricity, gas and water supply, Construction, Wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles, motor cycles and personal and household goods, Hotels and restaurants, Transport, storage and communication, Financial Intermediation, Real estate, renting and business activities, and Other community, social and personal service activities.

Apart from implementing NACE Rev. 1, a new methodology compatible with European standards has also been adopted. As a result, such details as items of materials used and sale of finished product for each activity had to be worked out on a totally different basis than before. The outcome was the set of tables for each activity shown in this publication. Basically the format of these tables is the same as in previous editions but the individual items may not be strictly compatible.

XI. NATIONAL ACCOUNTS AND BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

Explanatory Notes

EXPENDITURE ON GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT

Private consumption expenditure is estimated by adjusting the c.i.f. value of import statistics to cover customs duties and distribution margins. Estimates for locally produced goods are derived from statistics provided by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries and from Industry Statistics.

Services are estimated by using a wide variety of sources. Ad hoc questionnaires are sent to bus owners, hotels, travel and insurance agents and all other major companies. Outlays on electricity, water, telephone, petroleum and gas are supplied by the respective establishments. Expenditure travel abroad and tourists' spending in Malta are derived from statements furnished by the Central Bank.

Estimates of public consumption expenditure are obtained from an analysis of the accounts of the Treasury, and on returns from government departments and government entities.

Estimates of gross domestic fixed capital formation are based on an analysis of government capital expenditure records, import and industry statistics. Expenditure on imported machinery, vehicles and other equipment is estimated by adjusting the value of retained imports to include customs duty, other taxes and distribution margins.

Exports of goods and services and imports of goods and services as well as factor income from or to abroad are obtained from balance of payments data.

Taxes on expenditure and subsidies are derived from Treasury statements.

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INDUSTRY

Income from agriculture and fishing is based on information from fish, fruit and vegetable markets, Malta Dairy Products, civil abattoir and fish farms. Estimates of earnings of employees and profits in the manufacturing, mining, quarrying and construction industries are mainly derived from the survey of the manufacturing industry and Industry Statistics.

Government enterprises and public administration data are obtained from ad hoc returns and Treasury statements. Special surveys cover the transport, storage and communication sector which includes the national air and shipping lines, portworkers, land transport and travel agents.

Wholesale and retail trade profit margins are estimated on imports and domestic production while wages are based on Employment and Training Corporation figures. The Central Bank provides data required for the banking sector, while insurance is covered by an annual census. The real estate sector is monitored by means of data on duty paid on contracts and employment figures.

Income from property mainly consists of interest paid by banks originating from local resources, while rents paid and imputed are estimated by adjusting the latest Census of Housing data by the number of buildings completed each year. Hotels, complexes and guest houses, which are the most prominent actors in the 'Private Services' sector, are covered by an annual census. Data on private schools and cinemas are also obtained by censuses while ad hoc enquiries cover the other diverse activities of this sector.

A more detailed explanation is given in the National Statistics Office annual publication 'National Accounts of the Maltese Islands' and the 'National Accounts of the Maltese Islands: Sources and Methods' published in 1999.

GENERAL NOTE

National Accounts figures for 1994 were revised. As from 1994 data are not strictly comparable to previous years.

Explanatory Notes

BANKING

Deposit Money Banks and Other Banking Institutions forward monthly returns of their financial activities to the Central Bank of Malta which, in turn, provides the National Statistics Office with an amalgamated return.

INSURANCE

Insurance statistics (Life and Non-Life) were obtained from the Ministry of Finance up to 1993.

Data for later years were made available by the Malta Financial Services Authority.

REGISTRATION OF COMPANIES

Data on companies were obtained from the Registrar of Partnerships up to 1996.

The Registry of Companies within the Malta Financial Services Authority produced the data for subsequent years.

PUBLIC FINANCE

Data on Government finance are obtained from the Treasury, and refer to the receipts and expenditure of all Government departments.
